

CAR SEATS FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS



Specialized carrycots

These are recommended for children born prematurely or with respiratory problems, when it is advisable for them to lie flat.



Seats without side supports

On the seat or the sides so that the child can keep their legs apart, for example, children with a fracture that is in plaster or children with dysplasia of the hips.



Cushions, collars or caps

These help to keep the child upright (so they don't slip to the side) and keep the head upright using Velcro straps



Body harness

Designed to keep the child's torso upright and supported against the seatback (when using a booster seat and the child is using the seatbelt for support) used by children with restricted muscle development that find it difficult to maintain their posture.



Swivel seats

Can turn through 90° over a base, towards the car door, to make it easier to get the child in and out of the car.



Wheelchairs

The car, or for example, minivan or a van, must be adapted and have special anchors to provide proper support.
