


# WHICH SEATS ARE THE SAFEST FOR FITTING A CHILD RESTRAINT SYSTEM?

A new decree by the Spanish Government dictates that all children with a height of up to and including 1.35 m must use a Child Restraint System (CRS) and travel in the back seats of cars.

This legislative change aims to improve the protection of children travelling by car, since the possibility of suffering injuries in a rear seat in the event of an accident is less than in the front seats.

**Warning:** This is the most protected seat in the event of a side impact, but it does not usually have ISOFIX anchors. It is preferable to have a three-point seat belt

The law establishes that minors under 18 years of age and less than 135 cm tall must travel in the back seats. Only three exceptions are contemplated: that the vehicle is a two-seater; that the rear seats are already occupied by other children in their child seats; and that, due to the car's specifications, it is not possible to fit all of the child restraint systems there.

Child seats can be installed in both directions but never if the front-seat airbag is enabled
